

What is preservation? It's a difficult thing to describe. Is it the way the light and shadow dance along historic brick facades in winter? Perhaps it's the smell of cannoli wafting from the North End? Or the sound of bagpipes marching down Broadway? Maybe it's the crush of people gathered on Dorchester Ave once a year for the Vietnamese Night Market, or dressed in vibrant colors for Carnival.

One thing is certain. Preservation is more than bricks and mortar. It is the sights, sounds, experiences, and yes, architecture, that make a place unique. That define it.

Preservationists are storytellers. Truth-seekers who aim to tell the full story connecting people to place. Connecting people to the people before them. To the people around them. Storytelling is advocating. And advocacy is giving a voice to a community, saying their stories matter. Their history matters. This place matters.

The role of preservation is more important today than ever, as we navigate the weaving of politics and progress, promoting the full story while simultaneously embracing change and leaving space for the landmarks of the future. Cities are for people, and good preservation embraces the needs of great urbanism—climate resilience, housing density, and vibrant, stranger-filled streets.

I'm excited for the work ahead and thank you all for being part of this quirky metropolis we call Boston.

ADVOCACY

Legacy Fund

The Alliance helped establish the Legacy Fund in 2018 and has actively leveraged the fund in project mitigation, raising \$3 million (so far). In 2024, \$600,000 in funding was awarded to thirteen preservation projects across the city! These are not your standard preservation projects, but rather projects rooted in community and honest storytelling.

The Home for Aged Colored Women operated from the 1860s to 1940s. It closed and was largely lost to history. With support from the Legacy Fund, the names of the 130 elderly Black residents buried in Cedar Grove Cemetery will now be known and their stories re-memorialized. As will the stories of the residents at 42-44 Shirley Street, the likely home of those enslaved by Royal Governor William Shirley. And with help from the fund, America's oldest community theatre, the Footlight Club in Jamaica Plain will receive much needed maintenance.

Curatours

Preservation goes beyond bricks and mortar. Preservation is connecting people to the history around them. The Alliance partnered with the Dorchester Historical Society and Comfort Kitchen for a CuraTour that opened the **Dorchester North Burying Place**, the oldest Landmark in Dorchester. The gates are generally locked to the public and when history is locked away, it is forgotten.





Nearly 500 curious Bostonians joined us to tour the burial ground and connect with our shared history. Buried within are the remains of some of Boston's most prominent founding citizens, including minister Richard Mather and the first printer in Boston, John Foster. It also includes Governor William Stoughton, the Chief Justice during the Salem Witch Trials of 1692. It is Stoughton who sentenced 19 people to their deaths and is the namesake of Stoughton Street just outside the gates of the cemetery.




Bristol, Anne, Cambridge, and Betty are also buried here. Their stones are permanently marked with the names of their enslavers etched in slate. By opening the gates and connecting people to history, we can read their names and learn their stories. More CuraTours are in the works, so stay tuned as we continue to work to connect people to place.

Plan: Downtown

The Alliance continues to be involved in zoning reform for Downtown Boston. It has been over 35 years since Downtown last went through zoning reform. The Alliance has worked with a team of neighbors and organizational partners in efforts to rezone Downtown Boston, with a focus on preservation and reuse of our rare and unique historic buildings. Boston's historic streetscapes are one of its primary assets. Every city has highrises, but only Boston has the Ladder Blocks and Boston Common, the nation's oldest park. We continue to advocate for a preservation-first zoning model that preserves our historic streetscapes and treasured landmarks, while suppling a canvas for new layers of history to be added.



36th Annual Preservation Achievement Awards


Every year, all around the city, historic buildings are artfully restored, renovated, and sensitively upgraded, new buildings are constructed that enhance their historic context, and educational tools like blogs, podcasts, books, and websites are created to share Boston's stories.

From the spunky reuse of a factory in South Boston to new green space along the Esplanade, good stewardship leads to great placemaking for the community. This year's Award recipients exhibit outstanding stewardship, creating gathering places in their neighborhoods through thoughtful adaptive use and restoration.

But preservation is more than bricks and mortar. It is also ensuring stories of our past are remembered and that we all understand how and why our cities look the way they do. Great storytelling is a form of preservation.

Boston is full of noteworthy preservationists, but none are more deserving of the Susan Park President's Award than **Jean Carroon and Goody Clancy.** Jean is a preservation architect, author, educator, and a tireless advocate for the stewardship of existing buildings. Together with Goody Clancy, Jean has been a leading voice in sharing that building reuse IS climate action.

And lastly, the Alliance has our Codman Award for Lifetime Achievement recipient, **Roger Tackeff**, to thank for our decades of success as Boston's leading preservation advocacy organization.



The Young Advisors (YAs) expand and amplify our mission by engaging Boston's professional community. They are active participants in the Alliance at all levels, from community outreach and policy discussion to social engagement. Throughout the past year our Young Advisors have hosted events sharing and amplifying the stories of Asian American and Pacific Islander histories in Boston.

They kicked off the year making cards of admiration for Chinatown coupled with a tour of the neighborhood. This was followed by a Mass Humanities-funded program in Little Saigon and a new twist on the popular Libations for Preservation event. We celebrated the remarkable contributions of **Kenzie Bok**, **Karilyn Crockett**, **Lorie Ferriss**, and **Tam Le** for their dedication to preserving the rich cultural and social fabric that makes Boston unique.

About The Polish Club: The Polish American Citizens Club began in 1924 when a group of Polish World War I veterans invested their savings and purchased an old shoe factory, where they formed the Young Polish Men's Club.

In the late 1930s, the founders and members of Boston's Polish immigrant and Polish-American community came together to raise money and build a new building. In 1939, the new club, now known as the Polish American Citizens Club, opened its doors.
